The district is beginning to plan for the use of ARP ESSER funds to improve the indoor air quality in school facilities, including mechanical and non-mechanical heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems, filtering, purification and other air cleaning, fans, control systems, and window and door repair and replacement.

Beginning with the summer of 2021 and continuing for the summer of 2022 and 2023, GLSD will offer a summer school program to all students K-12 experiencing learning loss or are credit deficient. To eliminate barriers for families, we have partnered with the YMCA for on-site childcare. Additionally, we will be offering free breakfast and lunch to all students participating.

The LEA intends to spend the remaining ARP ESSER funds on upgrading projects to improve air quality in school buildings and purchase supplies to support learning loss.

At the elementary level, students will be immersed in a culture of literacy and a review of critical standards in
