

CCP Adjustments for Spring/Fall 2020

LETTER OF INTENT

-Letter of Intent deadline has been extended to May 1st

UNIVERSITY OF FINDLAY

-Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory option-University of Findlay has decided to allow students the option of selecting a Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory option for any Findlay course they are taking this Spring. Satisfactory is C (73%) or higher and unsatisfactory is C- or below. Students will have to decide whether or not they would like to pursue this option by April 24th. After April 24th students will not be able to change their mind. Students are to email their instructor or their counselor to let them know that they are choosing this option. **If a student receives an Unsatisfactory for the course then they will not receive any high school credit for the course and have to retake the course or another course in its place.**

- Testing for 2020-2021-To help assist students, UF will be waiving testing for Summer and Fall 2020 as long as the student is taking the course at their high school and has a 3.0 GPA.
- Students wanting to take Chemistry 130 will need to take a chemistry specific placement test or have a combined score of 53 on their science and math ACT test
- Students taking English 104, 106 and 150 can qualify for the class with a 3.0 GPA if they haven't taken the ACT test or Accuplacer Test.
- Students taking Spanish 220/221 can qualify for the class with a 3.0 GPA if they haven't taken the ACT test or Accuplacer Test.

STARK STATE COLLEGE

-**Stark State College is not providing the Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory or Credit/No Credit option this Spring.** Students must complete class with grade assigned.

- Testing for 2020-2021-To help assist students, Stark State will be waiving testing for Summer and Fall 2020 as long as the student is taking the course at their high school and has a 3.0 GPA. Eligibility has been determined as a 3.0 GPA for students that have not had a chance to test and will be provisionally admitted for classes. All Stark State Math CCP classes need qualifying math ACT score or a qualifying Accuplacer Test score. Students will be able to use an ACT score from June or July as a qualifying score for one of Mr. Meech's CCP Math courses
- Business lab and psychology course will accept a 3.0 GPA

UNIVERSITY OF AKRON WAYNE COLLEGE

- The University of Akron will be offering a **Credit/No Credit** grading option to all spring semester students, including College Credit Plus students. If a student elects the special Credit/No Credit grading option, the student will be awarded **Credit** if the final earned letter grade is C- or better, and they will be awarded **No Credit** if the final earned letter grade is D+ or lower. In either case, the Credit or No Credit will not be calculated into the college GPA. Students will have until 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, May 3, 2020 to make a final decision to take one or more courses for Credit/No Credit instead of a grade. If students choose the Credit/No Credit option and changes their mind, they can change back to the Letter Grade option in their Student Center in MyAkron as long as it is done by the deadline of 11:59pm on Sunday, May 3, 2020. **If a student receives a No Credit for the course then they will not receive any high school credit for the course and have to retake the course or another course in its place.**

-All CCP students at The University of Akron were instructed that they **must** consult with their instructor, high school counselor and CCP advisor before choosing the Credit/No Credit option. Their first step would be to confirm grades by contacting their instructors. If they would still like to proceed after confirming grades, they were directed to reach out to their high school counselor to discuss all the ramifications at the high school such as the impact on weighted grading and class rank, financial responsibility for receiving No Credit, and the impact on OHSAA athletic eligibility or future NCAA eligibility. After discussing with their guidance counselor, students were directed to contact their CCP advisor to discuss considerations at the college level such as required grades in prerequisite courses or specific letter grades in designated courses if they plan to pursue a future college major in a selective program. Students were asked to provide the name and email address of their high school counselor when they contact their CCP advisor so we can follow up. CCP students may elect the Credit/No Credit grading option for as few or as many classes that they would like. However, it is important that students discuss options with their college professors, high school guidance counselor and Wayne College advisor before they make a final decision.
